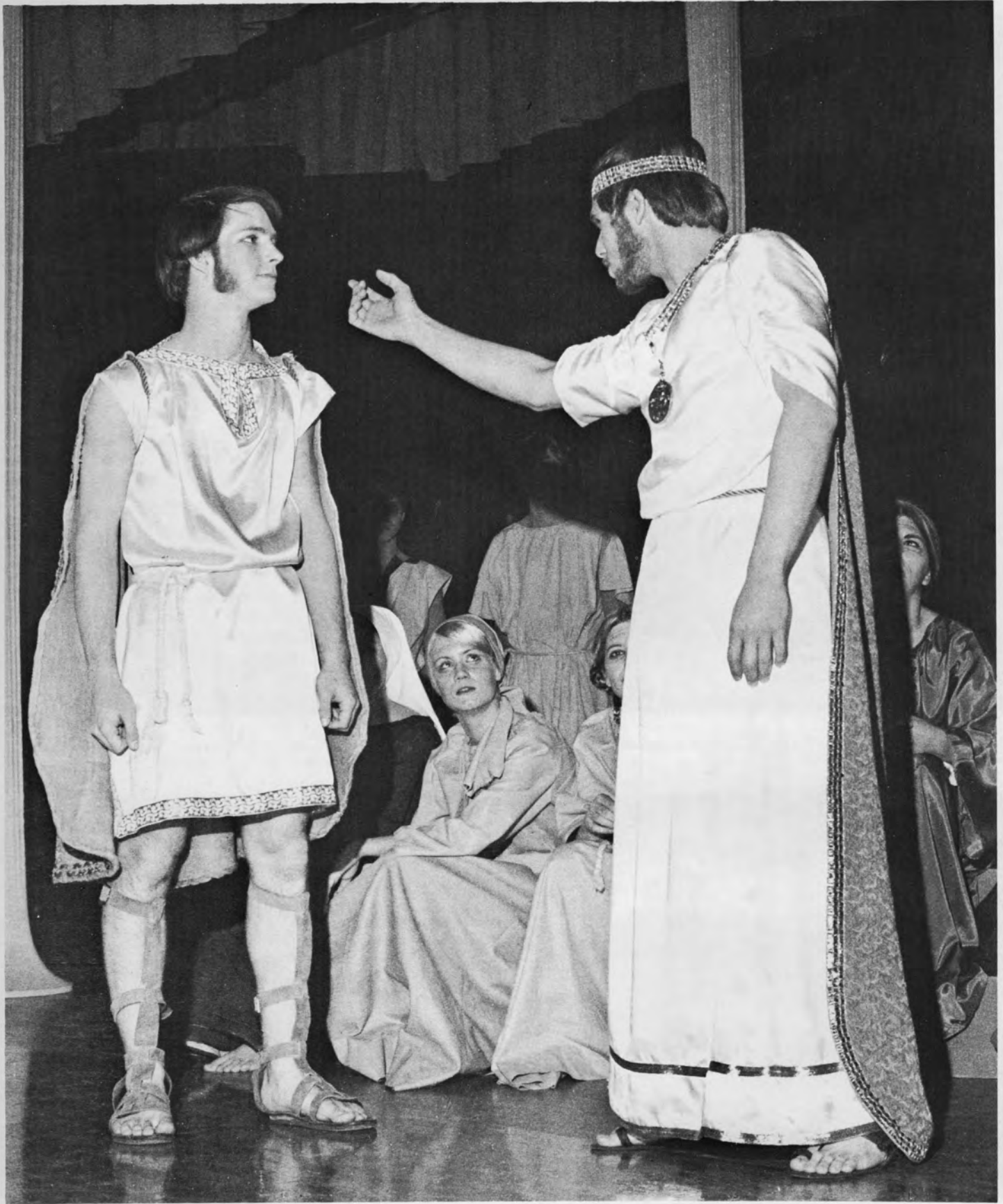

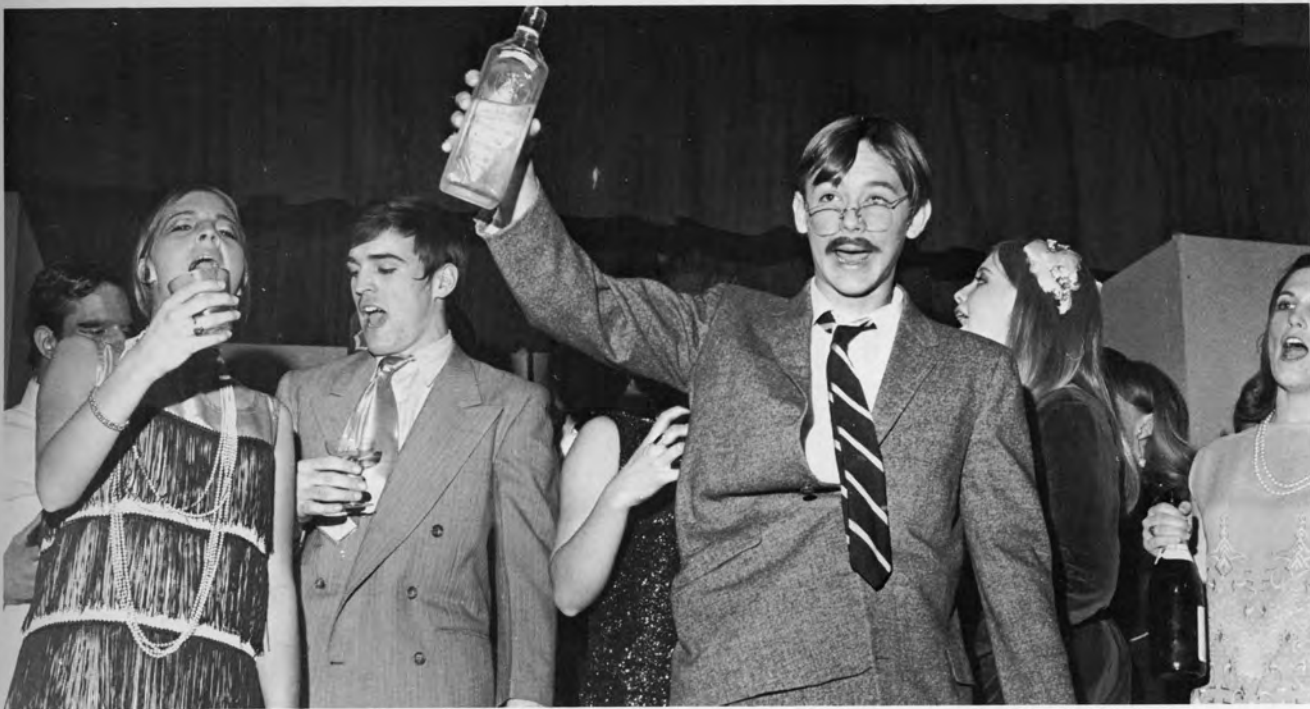

Principal Ted Murphy and vice-principal Bob Rogers leave Eisenhower after thirteen years of continuous and combined leadership. Mr. Murphy, before complete retirement, plans to serve as director of pupil personnel for next year. Employed by the Yakima School District since 1928, Mr. Murphy taught at Roosevelt Grade School and Washington Junior High and presided as principal at Washington Junior High, Garfield Elementary and Franklin Junior High. Starting in 1957 he has acted as principal of the new Eisenhower High School.

Bob Rogers, transferred from Yakima High School to the new Eisenhower High School in 1957 as Boys Counselor. Appointed by the State Board of Education he acted as co-chairman of the Evaluation Committee during 1958-59, for Yakima's new high school. Promoted in 1963 Mr. Rogers assumed the responsibility of vice-principal.

Dennis L. Peterson, has accepted the position as principal of Eisenhower High School after completing his doctorate at Michigan State University. Mr. Peterson was educated in Washington universities and taught in Wenatchee and Seattle public schools before becoming vice-principal of Bellingham High School in 1966.

In appreciation for the dedicated service in building Eisenhower into an outstanding high school the Eisenhower Cadets, the Year-book staff, and the faculty dedicate the 1970 Reveille to Mr. Rogers and Mr. Murphy.

Faculty, Retires

The English Department continued to offer a variety of subjects. Early registration enabled students to select classes and teachers, according to a pre-arranged package program.

A Technical Communications course, offered this year for the first time and taught by Jay Wilson, a certified Vocational English instructor, appealed to many seniors. This class, designed to educate students in the fundamentals of English, stressed vocational application.

Students utilized the audio equipment, now located in the Humanities Resource Center, by checking out tapes of music, lectures and plays.

During the fall trimester, Mrs. Renn's second period junior writing class created, filmed and produced a movie, complete with sound. Parents viewed the premier at Open House and the student body enjoyed an all day showing.

Retiring after 47 years of teaching, Jay Wilson came to Yakima in 1953. He started teaching at Franklin Jr. High and four years later, joined Eisenhower's faculty, teaching English, advising the Five-Star Journal and coaching debate.

Enrollment Increases Over Last Year

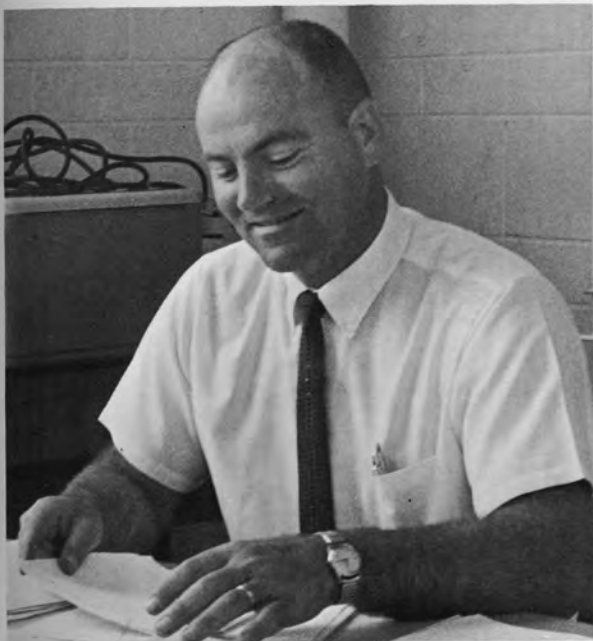

Data Processing Challenging

Staffed by six instructors, the science department offered a wide variety of courses ranging from first year biology to advanced physics.

Studying data processing on the computer, observing experiments in atomic physics and practice in modern principles of electricity challenged the advanced physics classes. Observation of sound by means of an oscilloscope proved beneficial to the first year physics students.

Chemistry students maintained a heavy workload from the many experiments to solving for unknowns in organic chemistry. Biology undertook the study of plants under various environments, animal systems and human existence in related projects.

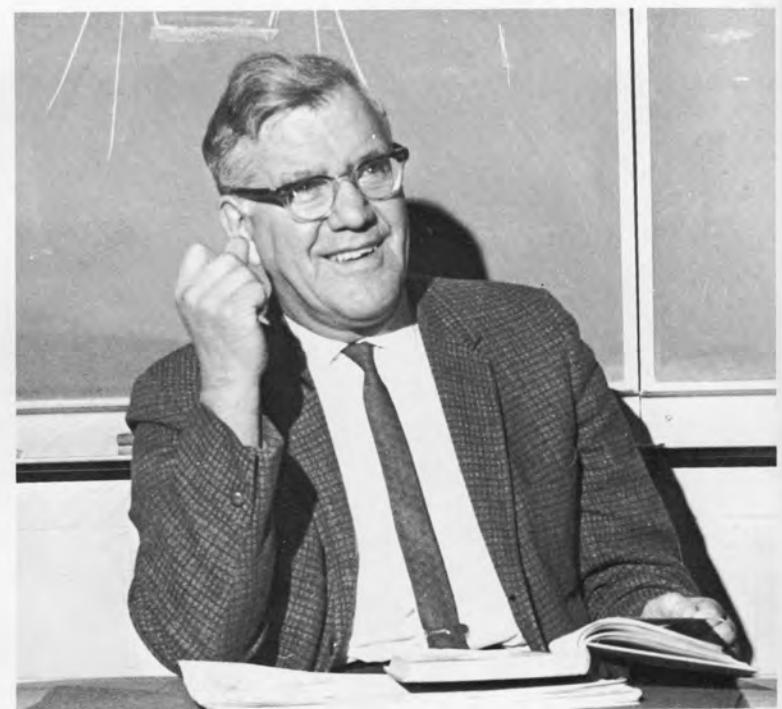

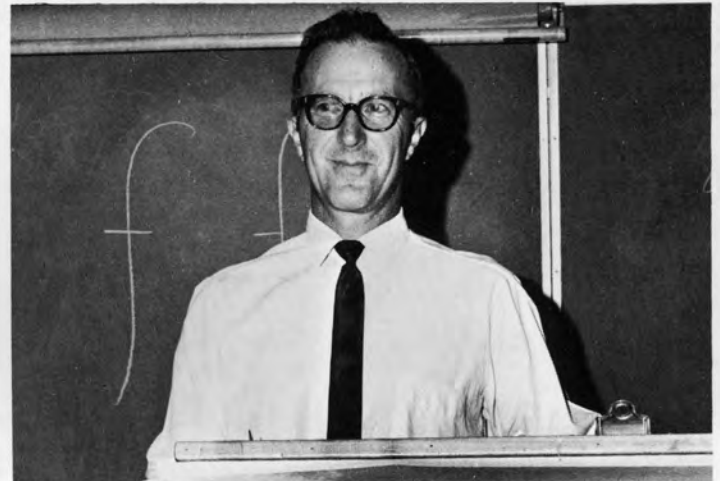

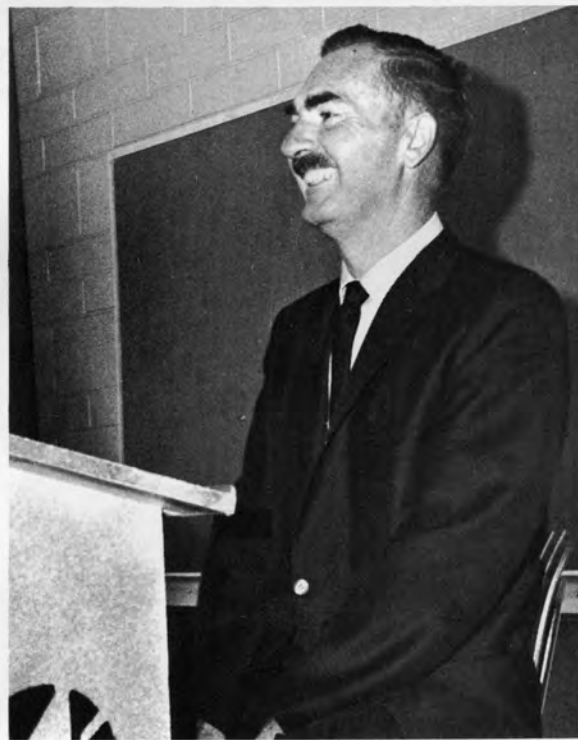

English Resource Center

Typing, shorthand, distributive education and book-keeping composed the business education department.

Students in Distributive Education applied acquired knowledge to part-time jobs required of students taking this course. This program offered students, who plan to work after high school, valuable experience needed to break into variety of job opportunities.

Industrial Arts included metal shop, power mechanics, plastics, drafting, woodworking, and basic

electricity. Students enrolled in mechanics practiced their skill by working on their own cars. This training proves valuable to students planning a mechanical career.

Students planning to enter the field of agriculture found five levels of courses available, each with its own level of F.F.A. Future Farmers of America aided the curriculum and encouraged these students to further their skills. Members participated in livestock judging and other competitive activities at the county fair.

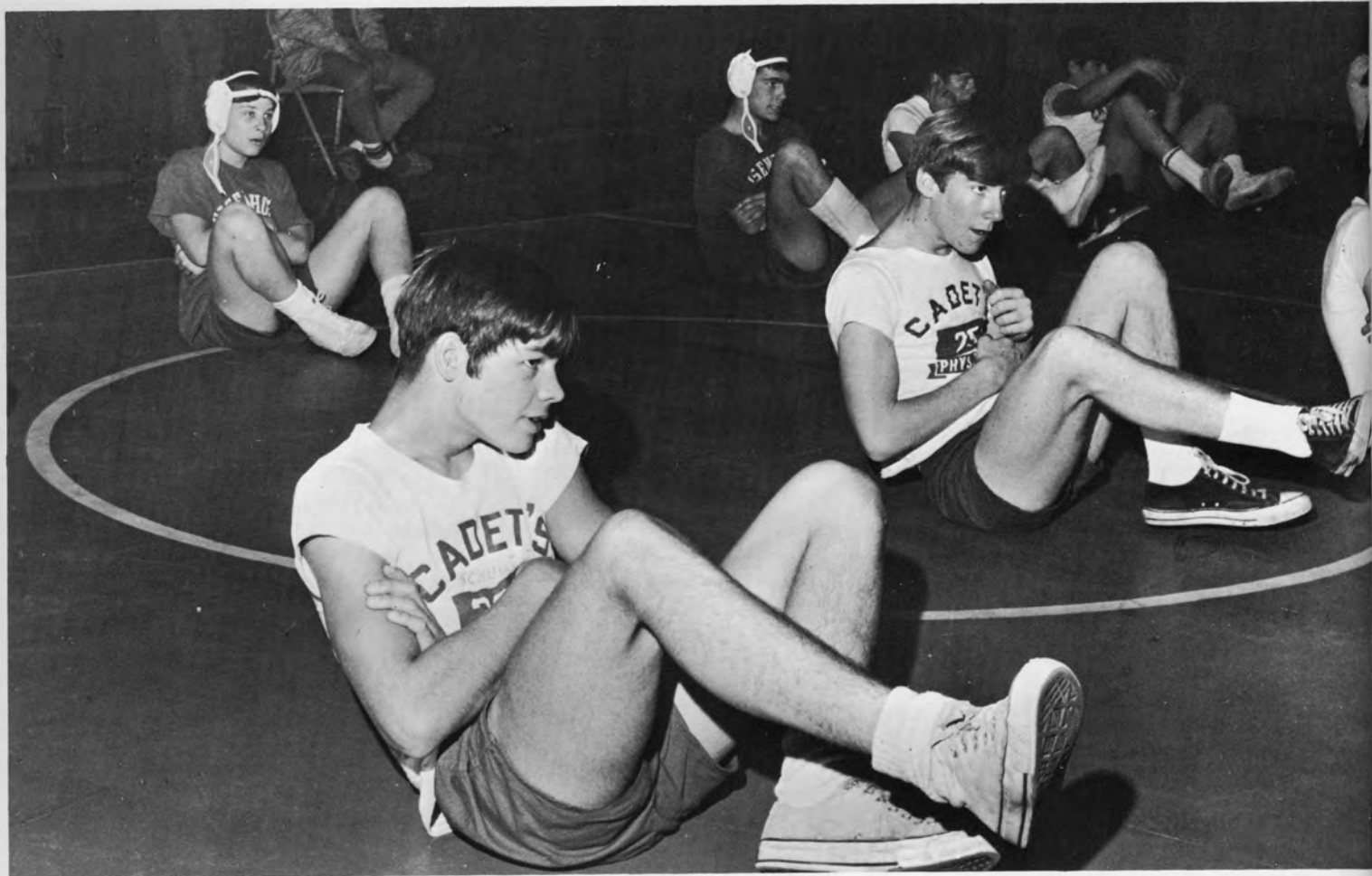

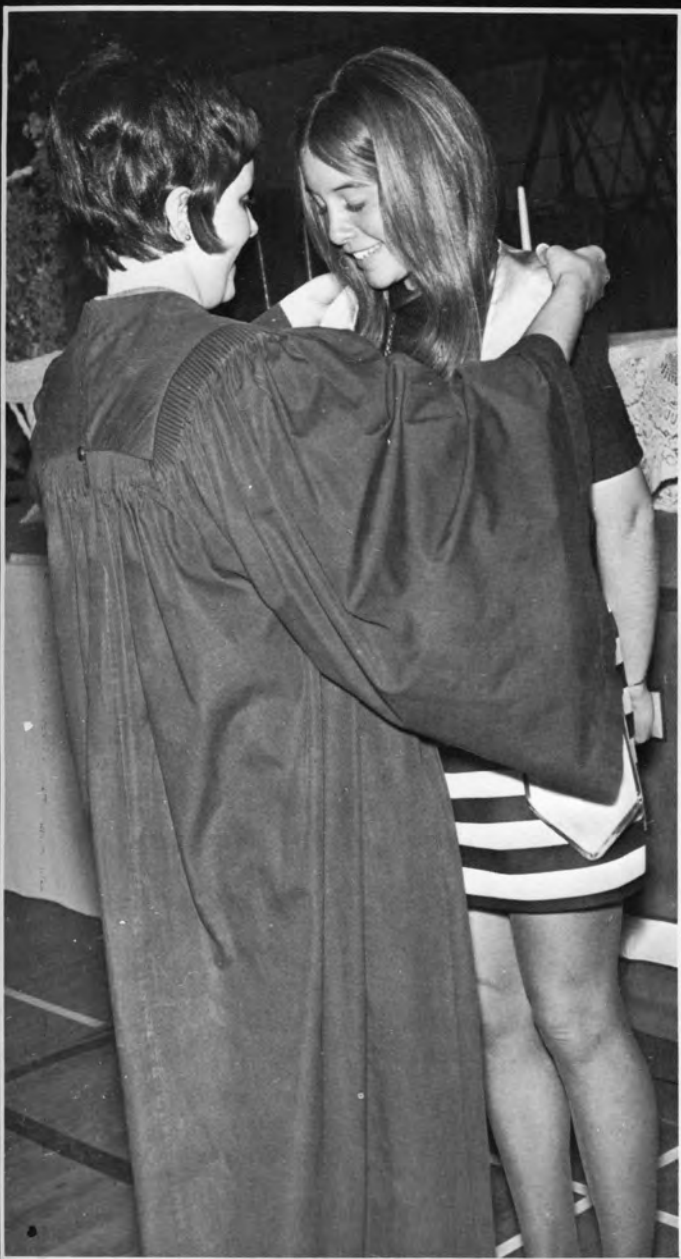

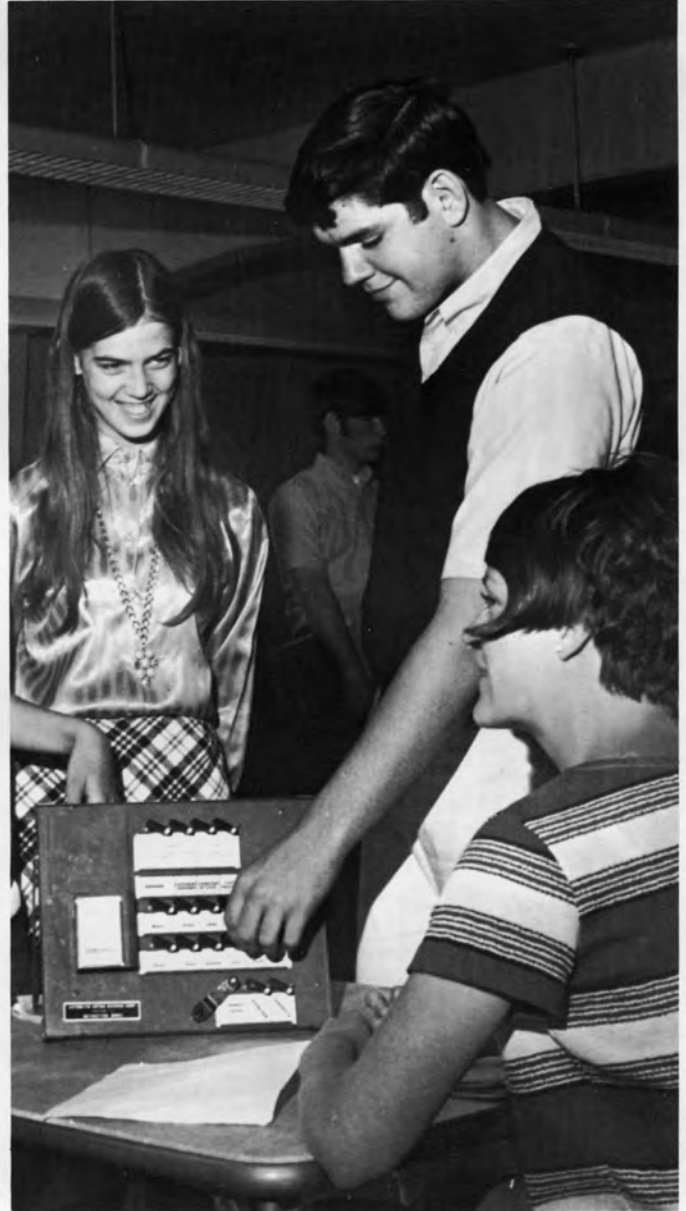

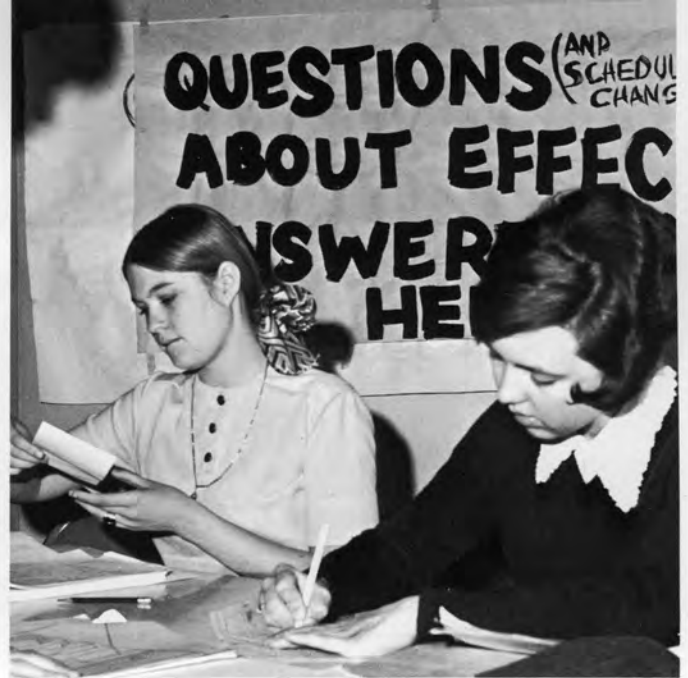

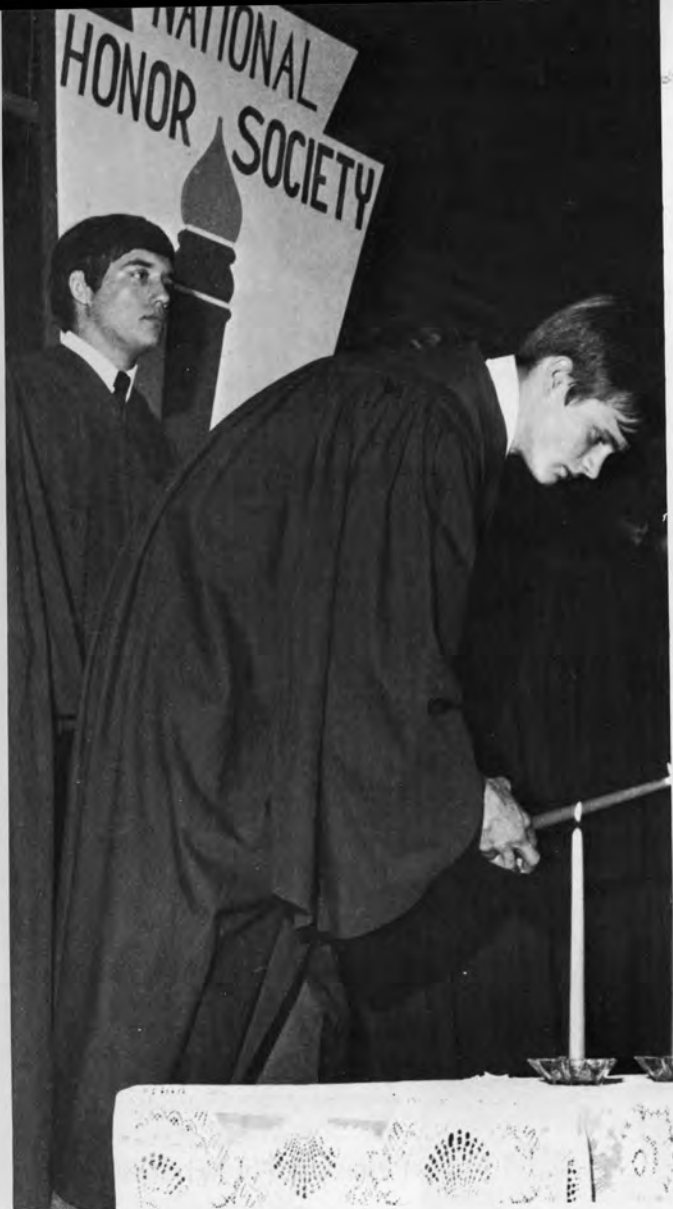

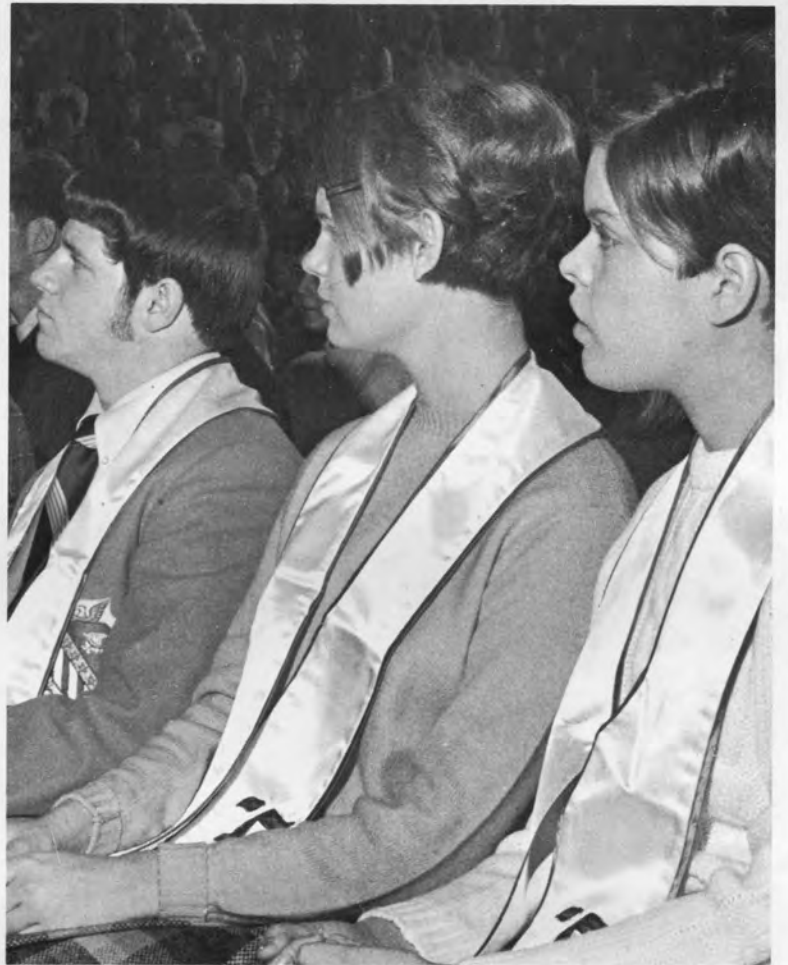

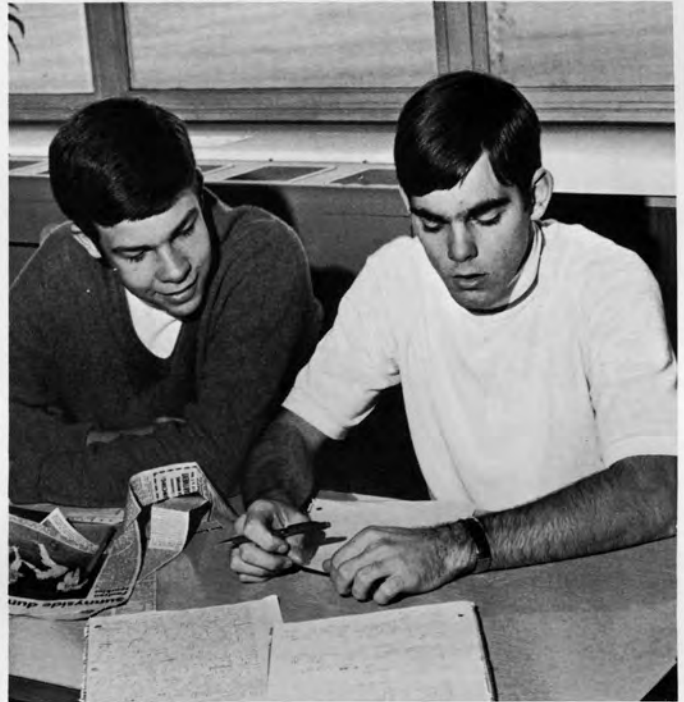

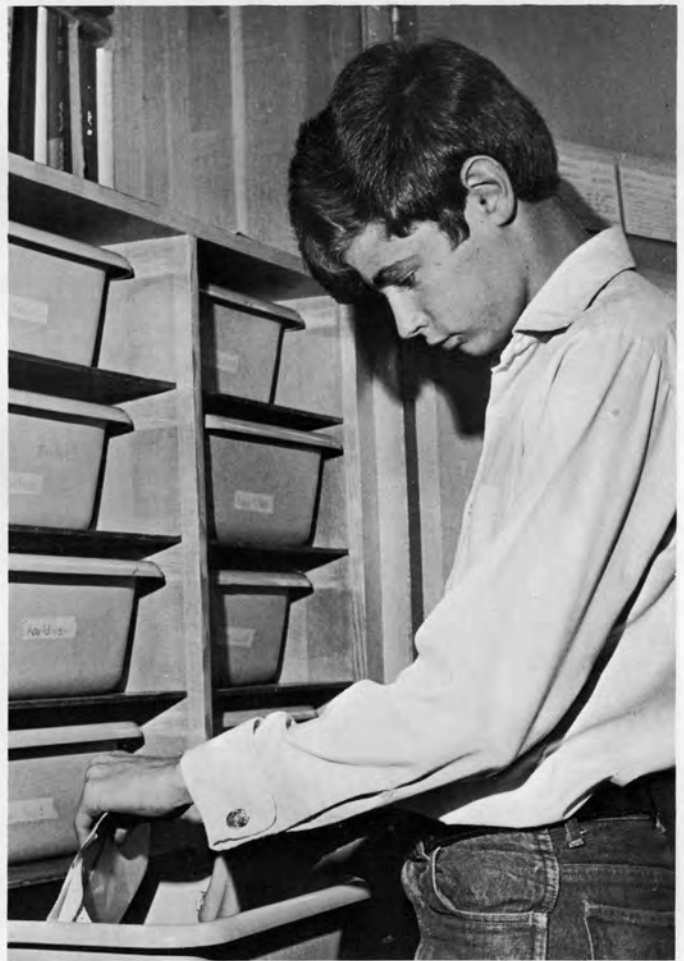

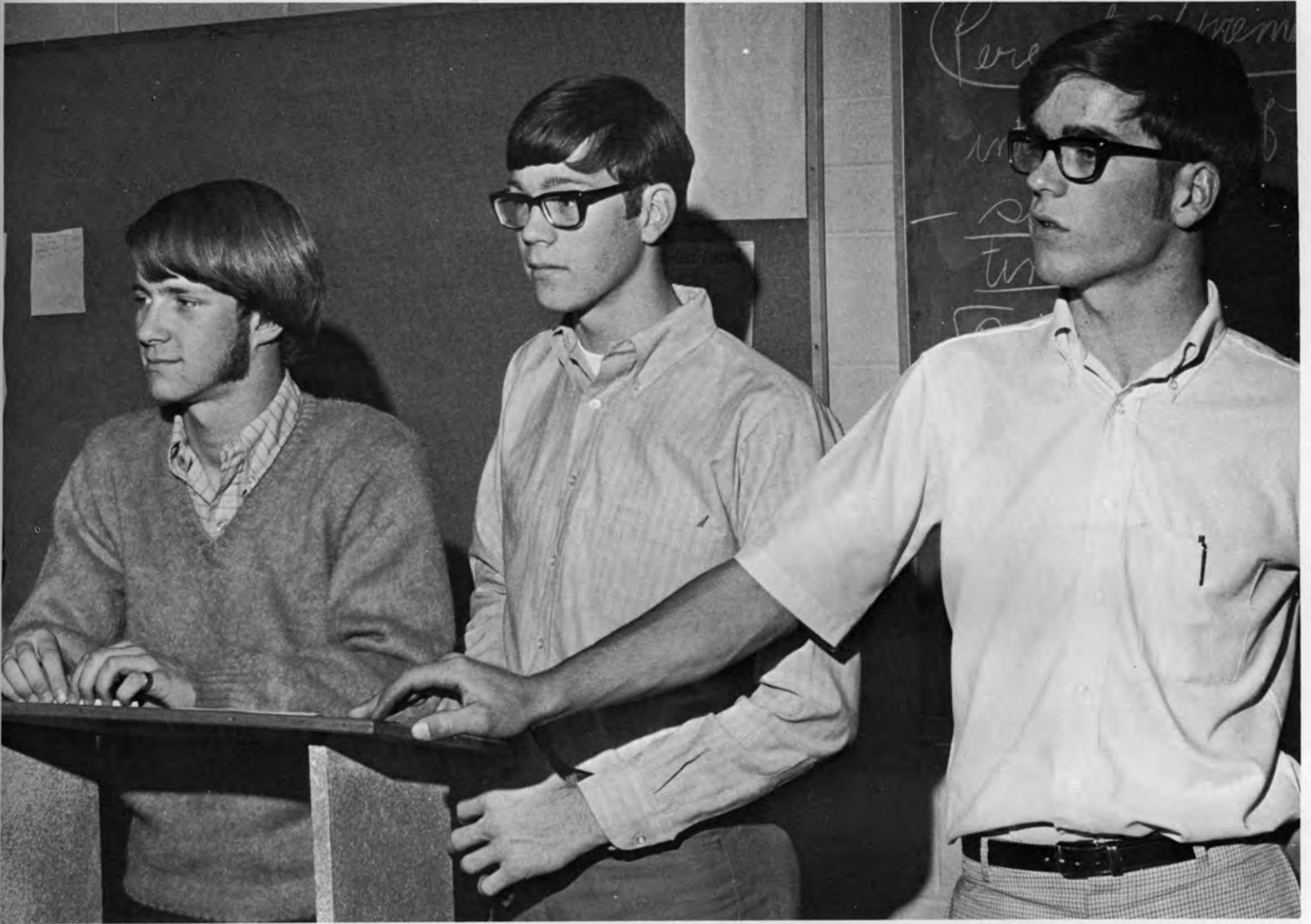

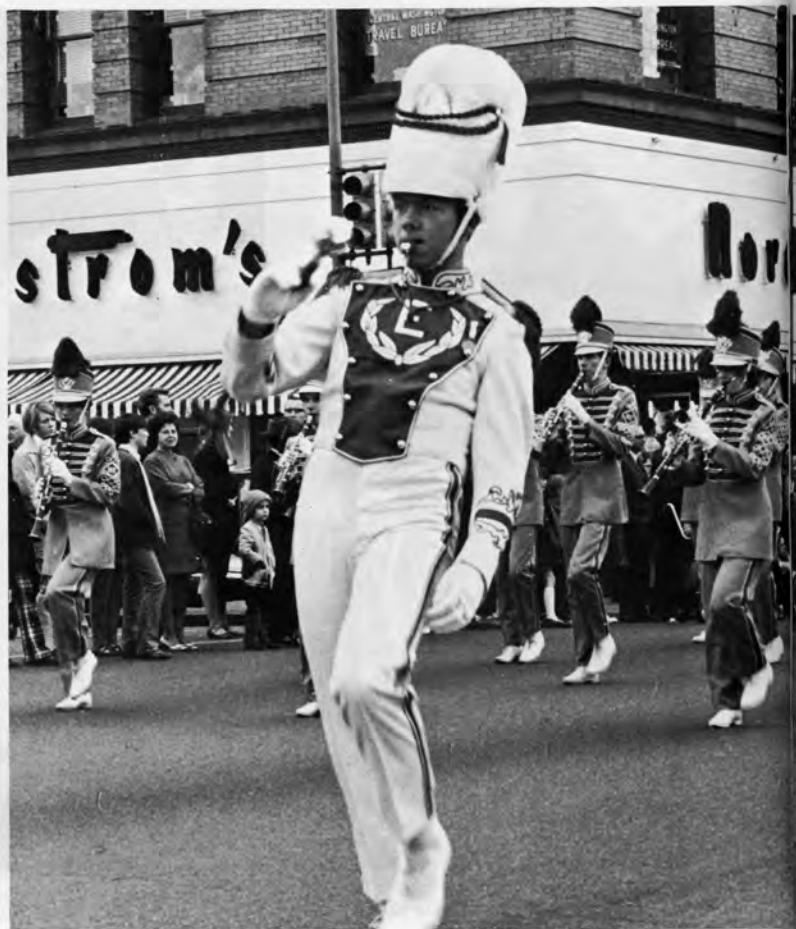

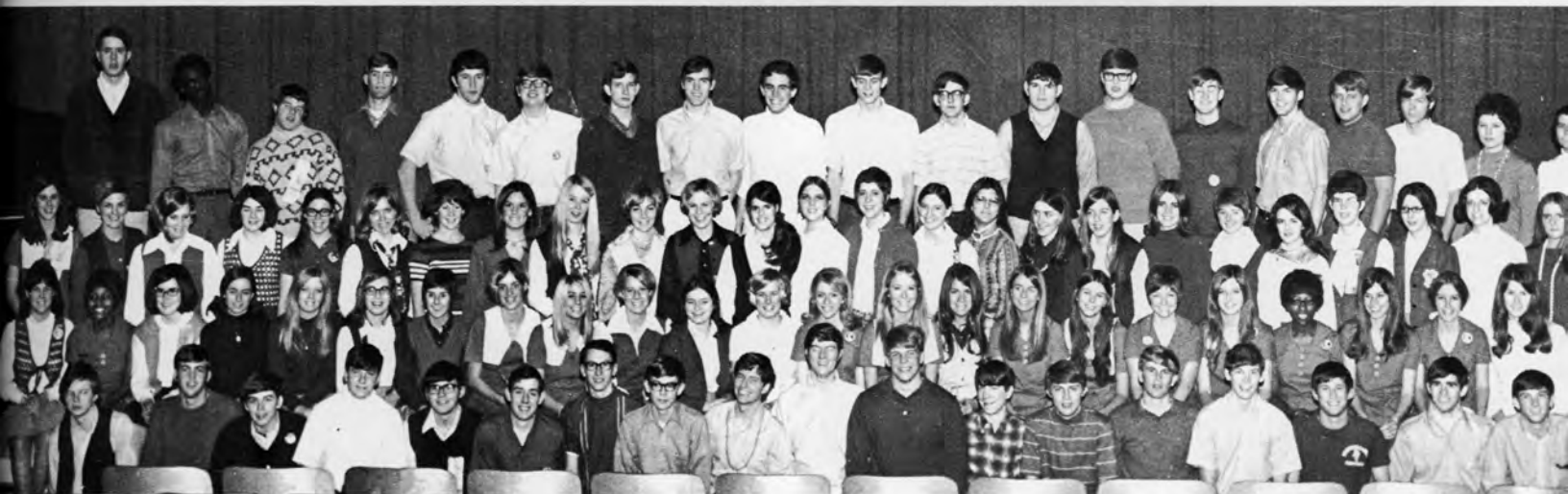

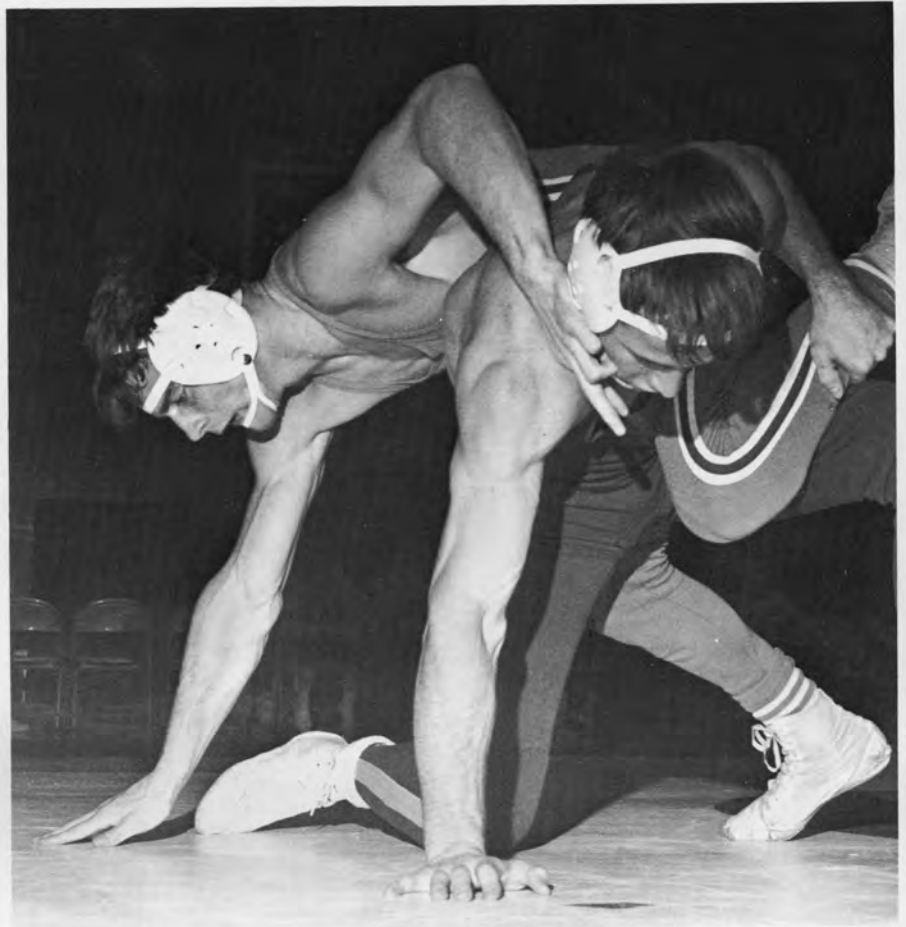

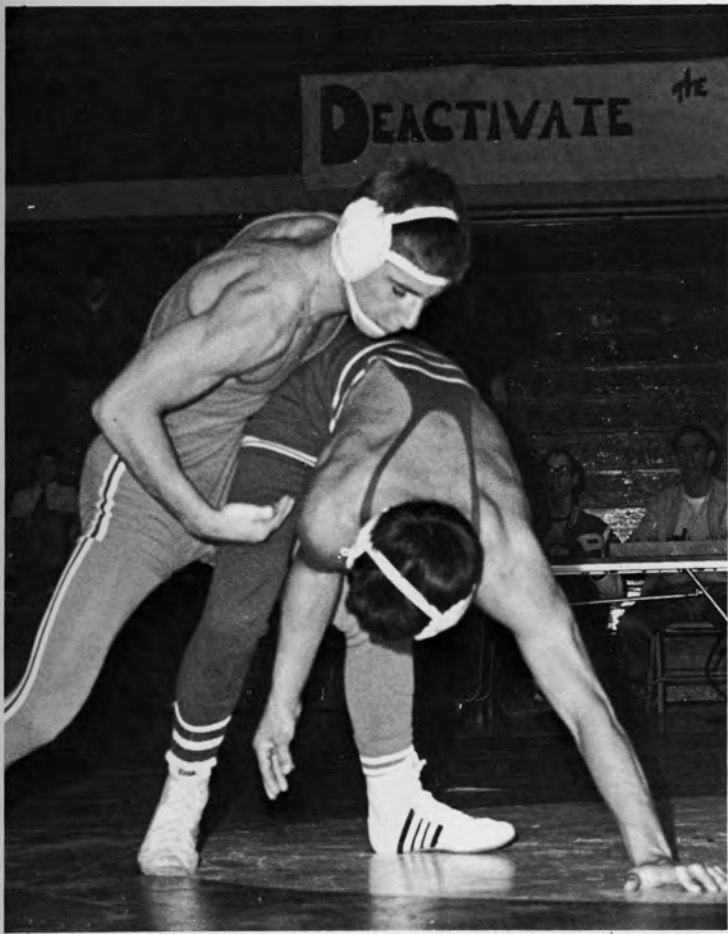

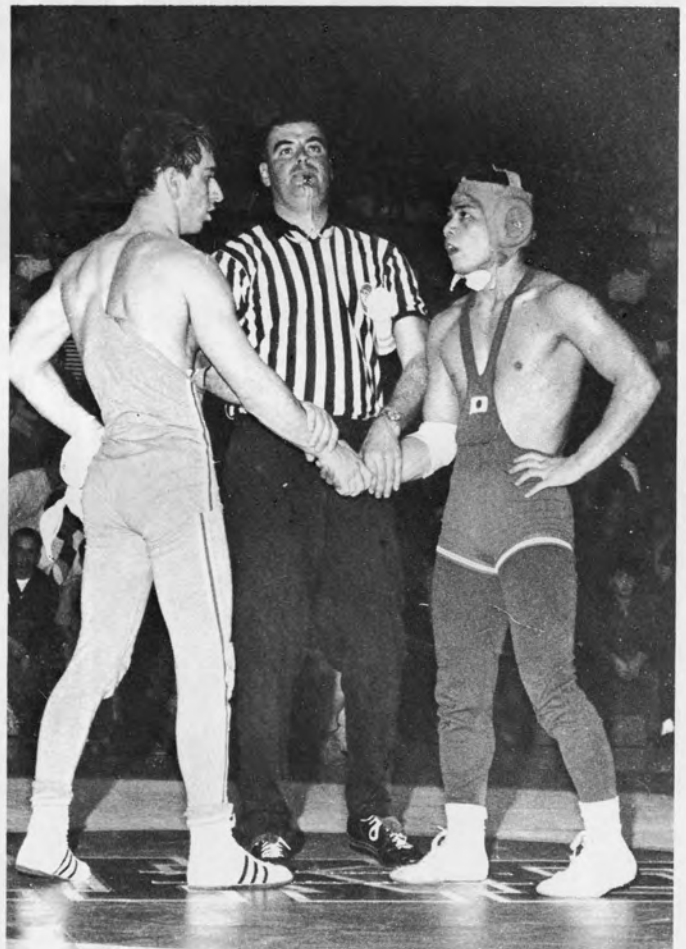

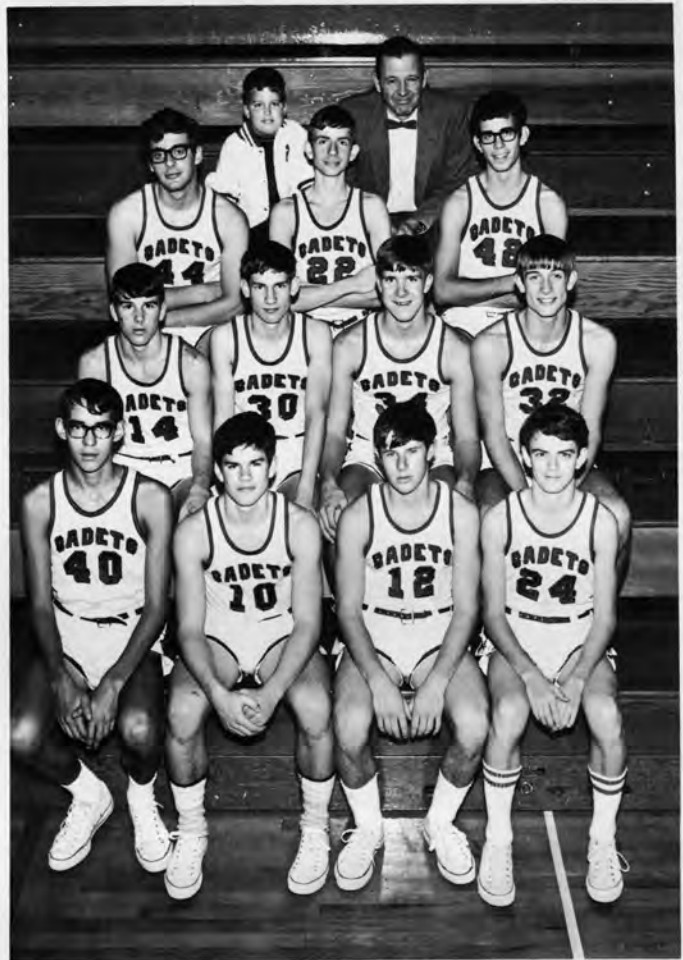

Accomplished by Cadets Over Davis

Ike's varsity started the '60-'70 basketball season by defeating West Valley for the ninth consecutive year. Followed by victories over Wapato and Selah, Cadets were tripped by Ellensburg in a battle that consisted of 74 fouls. A first contest between Carroll and Eisenhower resulted in a Cadet loss in double overtime, 66-64. Eisenhower completed non-league competition with a 76-61 win over Sumner and a 4-2 record overall.

Ike commenced league play by losing to the Kennewick Lions but rebounded to defeat Moses Lake, 60-46. Richland subdued the Cadets before Ike overcame arch-rival Davis, 56-54. Eisenhower lost the next three games to Pasco, Wenatchee and Walla Walla but bounced back to whip Moses Lake, 80-59, with Bob DiPietro contributing 25 points. Traveling to Richland, Ike defeated the Bombers for the first time in Richland's new gym. Wes Johnson's 20 points paced the Cadet's second victory over Davis and the first sweep for either club in five years. Ike spilt the last four ball games, losing to Pasco and Walla Walla while capsizing Wenatchee and Kennewick to end the regular season with 11 wins and 9 losses.

Eisenhower earned a birth in the district in the district tournament in Richland but bowed to Kennewick in the first contest, 70-57. Ike's 1969-70 Cadets received the annual Sportsmanship Award, given to the Big Eight school that exemplifies the best sportsmanship throughout the season.

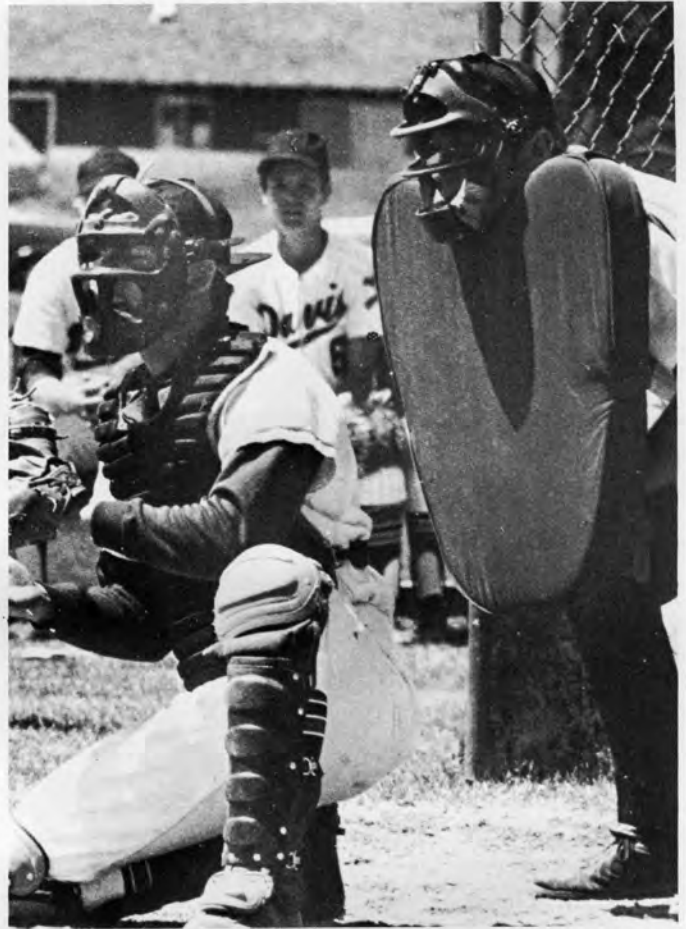

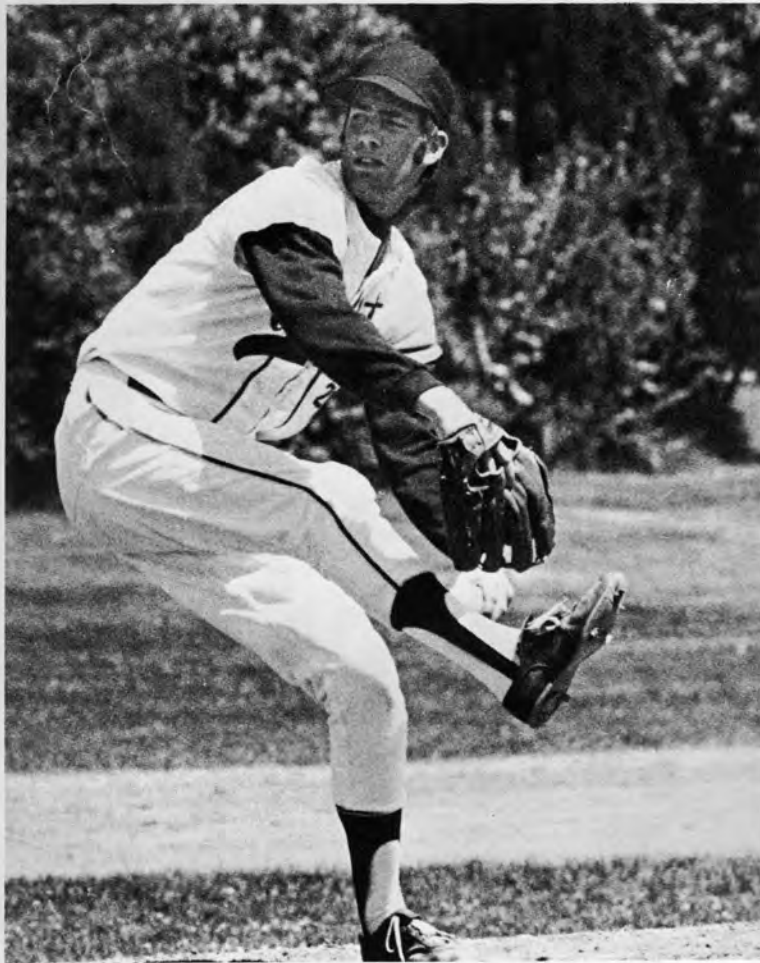

Eisenhower's 1970 baseball season resulted in 19 wins and six defeats. Ike finished with 10 victories out of 11 contests during non-league competition. Bob DiPietro highlighted the non-league season by pitching a no hit, no run game over Wapato. Craig Robinson powered the hitting during pre-season by smacking four homeruns, including two in Ike's first triumph over Ellensburg.

Cadet batters started league play by splitting a doubleheader with Walla Walla. DiPietro blanked the Blue Devils in the first game, 3-0, giving up only one hit. Traveling to Wenatchee, the Cadets divided another twinbill. Hosting Richland, Ike dropped two games to the Bombers, 3-4 and 3-14. Cadet pitchers Steve Myers and Bob DiPietro proceeded to fire two shutouts over Kennewick as Craig Robinson provided the hits by clubbing two singles, a double and a triple.

Cadet sluggers swept two games from Moses Lake, 7-1 and 7-6, winning the second game by scoring six runs in the bottom of the sixth inning. Cadets continued to win by routing Pasco twice. Dave Rippee's three-run homer in the bottom of the seventh inning accounted for Ike's come-from-behind victory. Eisenhower finished the season by dividing a doubleheader with Davis. Ike edged the Pirates in the first contest, 1-0, behind DiPietro's fourth shutout of the year to take undisputed second place in the Big Eight conference.

Along with setting a new strike-out record with 146, DiPietro led the club in hitting with a .417 average. Cadet players voted Danny Thompson Inspirational player of the 1970 season.

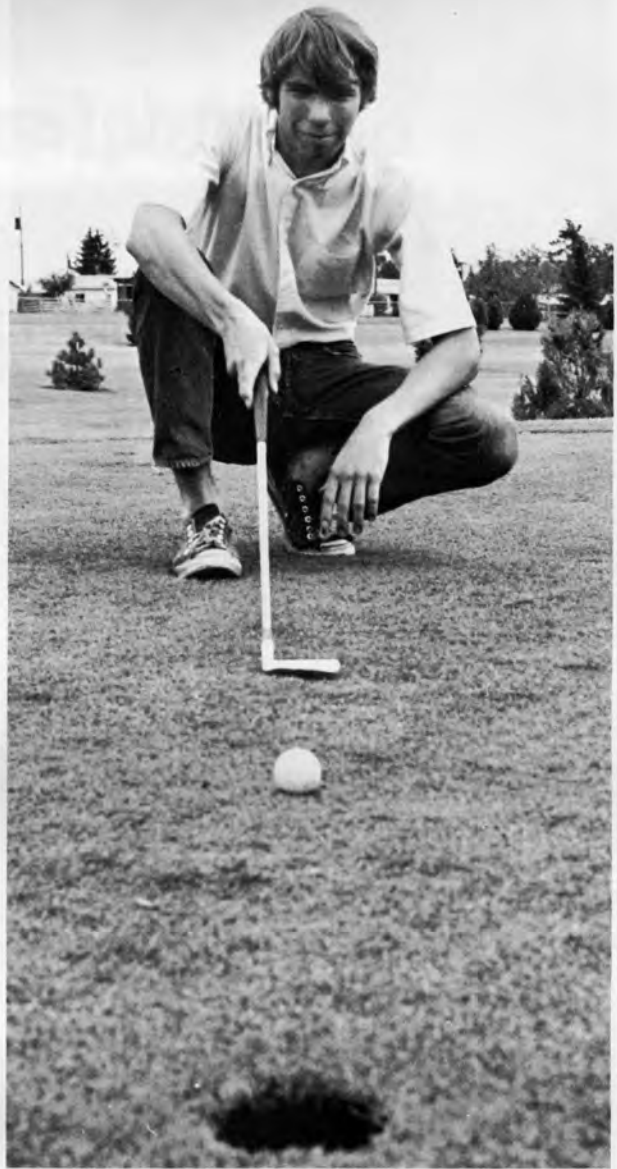

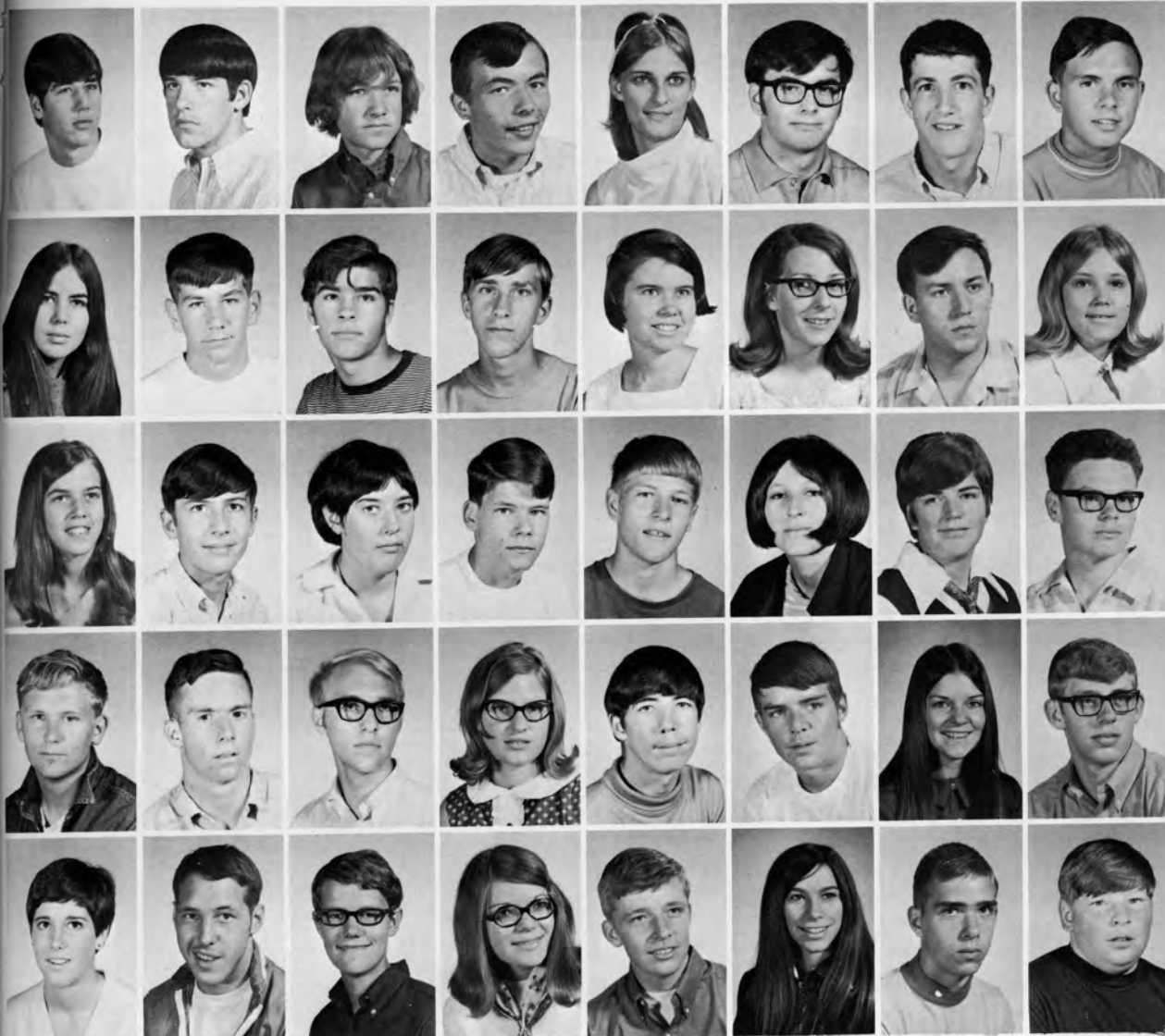
